

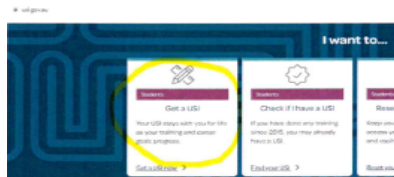
What is a Unique Student Identifier (USI)

- A USI is your individual education number for life. It also gives you an online record of your VET training undertaken in Australia.
- If you're at university, TAFE or doing other nationally recognised training, you need a USI. Without one, you can't get Commonwealth financial assistance or your qualification or statement of attainment.
- The USI is also required by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) to allow VET certificate results to be counted towards WACE achievement.

At Aveley Secondary College a USI needs to be provided before your Year 11 enrolment can be finalised.

You can get your USI online in about 10 minutes: <https://www.usi.gov.au/> at no cost. You will require one source of ID – a screenshot of your Medicare card is best.

Eligibility & Selecting Your Courses

- Consider your interests and abilities and your career aspirations. Remember if you enjoy the courses you study, you are more likely to do well in them.
- Some courses have academic or attendance prerequisites. Students who meet these prerequisites will be eligible to select these courses.
- You **must** only select courses from those for which you are eligible.

Review of Eligibility

- For students who do not meet these prerequisites or who are not eligible for courses that they would like to select, then a **review of eligibility** may be requested.

If Year 11 students do not meet the minimum achievement standard – students do not transition into Year 12

WACE Requirements

Students must meet all the following requirements of WACE as below:

Breadth and Depth	Choose at least 1 course from List A and List B courses in Year 12
Literacy and Numeracy Requirements	Meet the Literacy and Numeracy standards through NAPLAN or OLNAs as well as complete four units of English, two in Year 12
Achievement Standard	Achieve a minimum of 14 C grades in Year 11 and 12 units (or equivalents) including at least 6 C Grades in Year 12 Units (or equivalents).
Course / Endorsed Program Completion	Complete a minimum of 20 units (or equivalents) including a minimum of 10 Year 12 units (or equivalents). This includes sitting the Examinations invigilated by SCSA for all ATAR Courses.

Study Options

Students are offered three main study options which they can mix and match:

- WACE courses (three course types)
- Vocational Education and Training (VET Certificates)
- Endorsed programs

WACE COURSES

Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank (ATAR) Courses

ATAR courses are designed for students who are typically aiming to enrol in a university course directly from school. These courses will be examined by SCSA and contribute to the achievement of an ATAR. You must sit the final examination to complete the course

WACE COURSES

General Courses

General courses are designed for students who are typically aiming to enter vocationally based training or the workforce directly from school. These courses will not be examined. However, they each have an externally set task (EST) in Year 12 which is set by the SCSA.

Vocational Education & Training (VET) Certificates

- VET qualifications are undertaken as part of a student's senior school program at the College and enable students to gain nationally recognised qualifications for varied types of employment, and specific skills to help them in the workplace. Students undertaking a VET qualification are also encouraged to participate in Workplace Learning. For some qualifications this is compulsory.

Endorsed Programs

- Endorsed programs address areas of learning not covered by WACE courses. Examples include workplace learning, ASDAN and Cadets. Endorsed programs may replace up to two Year 11 course units and two Year 12 course units that you need to achieve your WACE.

Pathways Summary

- 6 Courses
- Combination of ATAR (3 or less), General and Certificate(s)
- Must include English (General or ATAR)
- Select at least one List B subject
- Workplace Learning may be possible

Preparation for TAFE, further training or employment

Year 11

- 6 Courses
- Combination of General and Certificate courses
- Must include English
- May include one ATAR subject
- Select at least one List B subject
- Workplace Learning encouraged
- May include external training program subject to application

Year 12

- 6 Courses
- Combination of General and Certificate courses
- Must include English
- May include one ATAR subject
- Select at least one List B subject
- Workplace Learning encouraged
- May include external training program subject to application
