Explicit Direct Instruction- the way we teach

Explicit Direct Instruction, referred to as EDI, is used to systematically and explicitly teach new concepts by breaking down the content, modelling skills and guiding students to mastery. These strategies help teachers deliver well-crafted lessons that explicitly teach grade-level content to all students the first time a concept is taught. EDI is applied in all classes. Teachers use a variety of methods to check for understanding. The use of individual student whiteboards to write down responses is one method that is utilised often.

EDI design consisting of:

- Daily Review
- Learning objective
- Activating prior knowledge
- Concept development
- •Skill development
- Lesson relevance
- Guided practice
- Lesson closure
- Independent practice



Homeroom Program

All students are allocated a House. The Homeroom program encourages positive House interactions through games and activities, house points, carnivals and lunch time competitions. Homeroom takes place every day (apart from Wednesday). Our 4 Houses are listed below.






Homeroom Program






URStrong Program

How does URStrong work?

URSTRONG is all about empowering kids with friendship skills! It is a skills-based strategy that teaches kid-friendly concepts, skills and language to help students build and maintain healthy friendships.





Academies & Squads

Extra-Curricular activities, called Academies, are available either before or after College hours apart from Wednesday afternoons.

Families and students will be notified each term which new Academies are offered that term. There may be an additional cost for some Academies.

Squads are specialist groups- usually trial based to be selected.





Student Expectations









The Aveley SC Behaviour Policy ensures clarity and consistency for students, staff, and parents, fostering a positive school culture. Our approach helps students develop self-discipline and responsibility for future success.

Our Behaviour Policy consists of:

- Behaviour Curriculum
- Set of expectations for students, staff and parents
- School rules for in the classroom and around the College
- Recognition and Reward strategies for students

We also apply varied interventions to support students make positive behaviour choices- known as REFLECTION and RESET.

Mobile Phones & Technology

Bring Your Own Device-BYOD

All students are expected to have a device to undertake their learning. Aveley SC has a focus on developing the digital literacy skills of students to prepare them for future pathways and directions. The Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) program supports the use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) across the curriculum. ICT provides significant educational value but also requires support and education for appropriate usage.

Increased capability in the use of ICT promotes initiative and independent learning; with students being able to make informed judgements about when and where to use ICT to best effect and consider its implications for home and work both now and in the future.

All Year 7 students will attend a compulsory excursion to Kalamunda Water Park on Friday 7 February 2025.


